Human Services provides multiple services to all age groups from prenatal to senior citizens. The department's focus is primarily on vulnerable and "at-risk" clients such as low-income families, children in need of protection, the aged, and the disabled.

Food Assistance Food Stamps or Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)

Food assistance is available for low income eligible individuals and families

Colorado Works/TANF serves low-income families with children and pregnant women by providing income assistance and supportive services to enable participants to find and retain employment and to provide for their families.

Family Medical Assistance for eligible low-income residents including children and families.

Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+) offers health and dental care for uninsured Colorado children to age 18 and health care for pregnant women, whose family earnings do not qualify them for Medicaid.

Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP) provides day care financial assistance to families who qualify.

Child Support Services include paternity testing, enforcement of support, legal services for child support orders and location of and strengthening support from non-custodial parents.

Child Welfare Program focuses on protecting children from abuse and neglect and assisting parents in improving their parenting skills and preserving family unity.

Adult Protection Services Program exists to protect at-risk adults from abuse, neglect, self-neglect, and exploitation through the provision of services. At-risk adults in Colorado will live safely in the least restrictive environment with dignity and independence.

Low-Income Energy Assistance (LEAP) provides assistance with part of winter heating costs for qualified families and prevention of utility shut-offs. Apply from November 1st through April 30th at county offices or call (866) 432-8435.

Park County Public Health provides pregnancy testing, breastfeeding education, communicable disease surveillance and control, free or low-cost immunizations for uninsured individuals and those who have Medicaid or CHP+, and emergency preparedness services. A Healthy Communities outreach worker provides assistance in finding doctors and other resources for children who are Medicaid and CHP+ eligible. Assistance is provided with enrolling in the Nurse-Family Partnership Program, an educational program for first time parents.

Services are not available for criminal, traffic violations or fee-generating cases.
