**SUBJECT:** Bailey Days Release and Hold Harmless Agreement

**DATE:** May 9, 2022

**EXPLANATION AND SUMMARY:**

Bailey's traditional community event, Bailey Days, will be held June 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> this year. Most of the activities will be on Bailey Main Street with some also to be held at the Community Center and McGraw Park. Parking will be along one side of County Roads 64 and 68, and at the Platte Canyon Community Church, with tractor-pulled hay wagons transporting people to and from the event. The event organizers will work with the PCSO, PCFPD, State Patrol and the Public Works Department to keep everyone safe and the traffic running smoothly. This event has been approved administratively but needs the Release and Hold Harmless Agreement in place for the use of Main Street and other County roads as well. The agreement has been signed by the event sponsor and is attached for your review, consideration, and approval.

**SUBJECT:** Bailey Hundo Release and Hold Harmless Agreement

**DATE:** May 4, 2022

**EXPLANATION AND SUMMARY:**

The Bailey Hundo is a mountain bike race and fundraiser that has been held for the past nine years. This year, Team Evergreen Cycling is the applicant. On Saturday, June 18, 2022, approximately 500 mountain bikers will start their 100-kilometer race from Berger Land Company property at 3396 County Road 68, and ride on County Road 68 and County Road 70 a total of approximately 6.8 miles before turning on to USFS trails.

A standard release and hold harmless agreement for the use of County Roads 68 and 70 is required. The agreement is attached for your review, consideration, and approval. The “Hundo” has also requested an Outdoor Event Permit for the start and finish of the race, and overnight camping for some of the racers. This has been approved administratively.

**SUBJECT:** Human Potential Running Races 2022  
Release and Hold Harmless Agreements

**DATE:** May 4, 2022

**EXPLANATION AND SUMMARY:**

The Human Potential running series includes three separate races in the Fairplay area. These races have been run since 2015, starting in Fairplay and using many USFS trails and County roads. Each is described below:

- The South Park Trail Runs will be Saturday June 11, 2022. There will be a 38-mile (Ultra) race, a 28-mile (Marathon) race and a 14-mile (Half Marathon) race, all starting in the Town of Fairplay and heading up County Road 18 towards Peerless and Horseshoe Mountains.
- The Silverheels 100 Mile Endurance Run and Last Call 50-Mile are July 9 and 10, 2022. The routes cover an area generally between Fairplay, Como, and the Summit County line.
- The Sheep Mountain Endurance Run, and The South Park Trail Marathon & Half are scheduled for Saturday, August 6, 2022. These runs will go west from Fairplay, south over Browns Pass, and loop back.

Maps for all races are provided as Attachment 1. As there will be no gatherings of more than 150 people outside the Town of Fairplay, an event permit is not required.

Since County roads will be used, Release and Hold Harmless agreements are required. The race coordinator has signed the agreements, and they are provided as Attachment 2.

**SUBJECT:** Tarry-It-Up Mountain Top Cycling Club Bicycle Ride  
Release and Hold Harmless Agreement

**DATE:** May 10, 2022

**EXPLANATION AND SUMMARY:**

The Tarry-It-Up Bicycle Ride is a fundraising event for the Mountain Top Cycling Club of Woodland Park. It will be taking place on Saturday, July 30, 2022. Last year, this ride got about 50 participants. This year, they are hoping for around 100 - 120. The event will include three rides with different distances (30-, 50- and 60-miles) on Park County Road 77. The start/finish line will be at mile marker 32 on County Road 77.

Because they are expecting less than 150 riders and staff, this event does not require an Outdoor Event Permit, but a standard Release and Hold Harmless Agreement for the use of County Road 77 is required. The Release and Hold Harmless Agreement, signed by the event sponsor, is attached for your review, consideration, and approval.
